Here are the concepts that will be tested using true and false:

- "Material" refers to what an object is made from. (lesson 1)
- All materials can be traced back to being made from something natural. (lesson 18)
- "Structure" refers to the supporting part of an object; it is what makes it stand up. (lesson 2)
- There are many different materials that can form the structure of an object. (lesson 11)
- Humans have 5 senses, all of which are used to make observations. (lesson 4)
- We use different words to describe observations made by our different senses. (lesson 5)
- Objects are made for different purposes. (lessons 6 and 7)

Here are the remaining questions on the test:

- Label the pictures with an "N" for natural or an "M" for man-made. (lesson 17)
- Fill in the information about the pictures students will be asked to list the object, material, where the material comes from, and the purpose of the object.
- What are 3 things an architect thinks about before designing a building? (discussed in lessons 10 and 11)
- List 6 different fasteners. (lesson 13)
